

Pachinko by Min Jin Lee (January 25th)

Pachinko follows one Korean family through the generations, beginning in early 1900s with Sunja, whose unplanned pregnancy threatens to shame the family. Deserted by her lover, Sunja is saved when a young minister offers to marry and bring her to Japan. So begins a sweeping saga.

by Jodi Picoult (May 24th)




Defending Jacob

by William Landay (September 27th)

When his 14-year-old son is charged with the murder of a fellow student, assistant district attorney Andy Barber is torn between loyalty and justice as facts come to light that lead him to question how well he knows his own son.



The Silent Sister

by Diane Chamberlain (February 22nd)



True account of the early 20th century murders of dozens of wealthy Osage and law-enforcement officials, citing the contributions and missteps of a fledgling FBI that eventually uncovered one of the most chilling conspiracies in American history.

by Martha Hall Kelly (March 22nd)

The lives of three women meet at the Ravensbruck concentration camp. Caroline resolves to help from her post at the French consulate, Kasia becomes a courier in the Polish resistance, & Herta takes a German government medical position.

by Anthony Doerr (July 26th)


A blind French girl on the run from the German occupation and a German orphan-turned-Resistance tracker struggle with their respective beliefs after meeting on the Brittany coast.

by Ann Hood (November 22nd)



by Rachel Simon (April 26th)


A novel about a woman who can't speak, a man who is deaf, and a widow who finds herself suddenly caring for a newborn baby.
